Attend Classes at Farmingdale State College as either a Matriculated or Non-Matriculated Student

What is Matriculation? Official acceptance into a degree or certificate.

Both Matriculated and Non-Matriculated Students

- Receive Academic Advisement.
- Pay same tuition & fees as in-state and out-of-state residents.
- Have access to FSC resources, e.g., tutoring, library, computer lab, Nexus Center for Applied Learning and Career Development, and clubs.
- Are eligible to complete a Student Housing application and live on campus.
- Must maintain FSC's academic standards by earning a grade point average of 2.0 or above (2.0 GPA does not ensure admission into a degree program).

Matriculated Students (officially accepted into a program)

- Apply using either the SUNY or Common Application farmingdale.edu/apply.
 - Pay a \$50 application fee, Fee Waivers are available for those who qualify.
- Can apply for Financial Aid (Federal & State) with submission of the FAFSA: Free Application for Federal Student Aid.
- Have priority registration.
- May participate in one of our Division III Sports teams.

Non-Matriculated Students (not accepted into a program)

- May apply credits toward toward a degree at FSC or another institution.
- Required to complete the Non-Matriculated Student Application farmingdale.edu/apply/non-matric.
 - Pay a \$50 application fee.
- Are not eligible for Financial Aid.
- Register later than matriculated students.
- Register for no more than 5 classes and a maximum of 16 credits per semester.
- Can earn a maximum of 32 credits, at which point the student will seek admission to a degree program or request permission to continue taking courses.
