How to login to Degree Works:

1. Go to <https://www.farmingdale.edu/registrar/degree-works/index.shtml> and click on the "Degree Works Login" link
2. Select your school from the dropdown menu
3. To authenticate your login, use your network username and password.

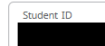
Once you log in, you'll see your Degree Works dashboard, also referred to as your Worksheet (Audit). The Academic Audit is your default landing page.

On the Academic Audit, you'll find important information about your academic record, including your major, degree program, classification (Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior), GPA, and other student information.

Additional details may also appear based on your individual academic record. For example, if you have a hold on your account, it will be displayed in this section of the audit. If you do not have any holds, no hold information will appear. If you elect a preferred name, your audit will display your preferred name.

Directly below the student information block are several degree requirement blocks. The Degree Progress section shows the percentage of your degree requirements that you've completed or are currently working on. Think of this as a quick snapshot of how far you've progressed toward graduation.

Each block is organized by a group of program requirements. In most cases, you will see blocks for **General Education**, **Liberal Arts**, and your **Program Major**. Some programs also include a **Concentration** requirement block. General Education requirements may vary by program.

The top of the block lists the block title, completion status, credits required, credits applied, catalog year, and GPA of courses within that block.

Starting from left to right, there is the completion status icon, the title of the requirement, course subject and number, course title, grade received, credits, term taken, and whether or not the course was repeated.

Transfer courses are noted with a line that reads: 'Satisfied by:', followed by the course, title, and transfer school.

For unmet requirements, the line reads: 'Still needed:', followed by courses that can be taken to fulfil the requirement. This could be one, two, or a multitude of course options.

When reviewing your audit, you can access detailed course information directly within Degree Works by clicking on any course with a hyperlink. Some requirements are hardcoded and detailed information is not available for the course.

Clicking the 3 dots opens a menu with the GPA Calculator, which lets you calculate the grades needed to achieve and maintain a specific GPA; Class History, which provides a list of your attempted credits and courses; and Notes, which your advisor can use to communicate with you through your audit.
